GENERAL QUESTIONS

PART I: Only ONE of the answers is correct. You are to circle the letter next to the correct answer.

1. On removing any firearm from your vehicle or when removing firearms from their cases, pistol box, or container, you should...
 - A. be sure the safety is applied.
 - B. check to make sure the gun is unloaded, the action is kept open and if possible, magazine removed.
 - C. point the firearm in a safe direction and pull the trigger to see if it is empty.
2. On shooting any firearm, if the recoil and noise seems much weaker than normal, you should...
 - A. fire another shot to see if the gun is okay.
 - B. have someone else shoot the firearm.
 - C. before firing again, check the gun for a bore obstruction.
3. On the range, loaded pistols and rifles must always...
